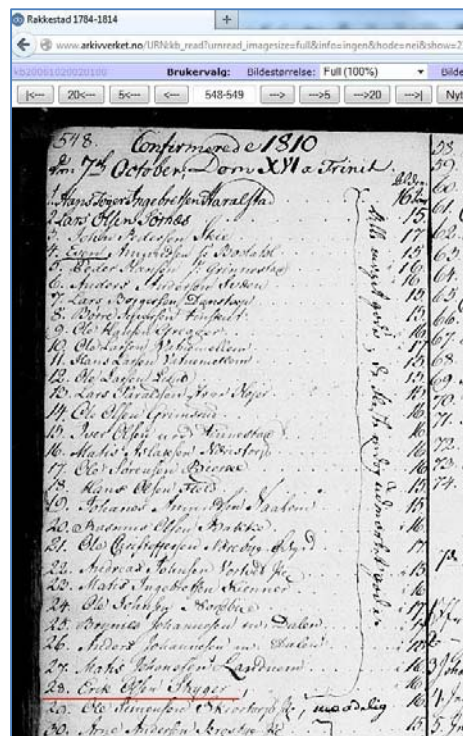

**The silver tax** was actually a compulsory payment that was introduced to secure enough funds to start Norges Bank. The more or less independent Norway desperately needed silver. Silverware, silver medals, jewelery and silverware were sacrificed for Norway's cause. Finally with voluntary coercion. Finally with voluntary coercion. To ensure a solid economy and have credibility abroad, Norway must have a state central bank. In 1816 it was decided that Norges Bank should be established. It was stated in the law on the monetary system that the bank should have a silver fund of between 2 and 3 million kroner. This was money the state did not have, but which they had to raise. At first it was to be tried with a voluntary deposit, but if it did not last, it had to be forced. The bank would be located in Christiania (formerly the name of Norway's capital, today Oslo, name from the early Middle Ages).
